

The AI-Wise Education: A Visual Mental Picture

Hello, I am back again to help you picture how this program fits into your school year, a few months from now.

At the start, I mentioned offering it as an elective for seniors. You may also recall our team saying that students can join at any time, and that IOLEBA lets the credits you have acquired be used later. Let's walk through what this means.

Our program is a workforce preparatory program. It helps people in a few different ways: to retool for a future AI-related position, to build their own online business, or to gain the AI knowledge that carries them into college or a trade.

Here is what we suggest. Offer the program availability once students are back and settled into their regular schedule. Launch it on Thursday, October first, and run it through Friday, April thirtieth, 2027. We will provide the modular calendar and the recommended assembly times. We will also give you the information materials, a website where students can learn about the program, and an email and flyer for students and parents.

Now, you might be thinking, it is an elective, but my students have football, band, or even a part-time job. That is all fine. The student works at their own pace. Say a student cheers for the football team and does not want to start until January. That is fine. You might worry they would feel pressured to finish by April. They would not. This is a workforce program that teaches lifetime skills, so if a student needs more time, IOLEBA provides the student with a **General Membership** permitting them to complete their program even after they graduate from high school. Upon completing the fourteen modules, they continue as an **Entrepreneur Member**.

What about the assemblies? Won't a student fall behind? In a Guild assembly, you are never behind. You present wherever you are, and the mentors, other students, and members help you along the way. One student says, "I did that; let me show you how. Another says, " Wow, that is the practice business I am building too; maybe we could work together. That is the assembly working the way it is meant to.

Let me give you an example. Say you want to teach the Battle of Gettysburg, and close with the dedication of the national cemetery that November, where Lincoln gave his famous address of just a few hundred words. AI can help the student build the lecture, gather the media, and shape the intriguing questions they bring to the assembly. The moderator opens the dialogue, and the members share what they learned. Here is the difference in our program. The student does not walk away with a certificate for finishing a course. They walk away knowing how to build that course themselves, using every AI tool and service at their command.

So, when we say students can join at any time, we mean it. This is the real shift. This is the future of AI education, a program built around the lives we actually live in 2026, not the old nine-month calendar. Education is moving in a new direction, and your school can be one of the first to lead the way.
